During 2017, Cabinet held 8 sessions. President Barrow noted that expectations are high and that his government has to place urgency on a transformative national development agenda in line with the Coalition manifesto. He highlighted the huge task ahead and the need to be action oriented. He set out the priority areas to include the energy sector, fixing the broken economy, unifying the nation, improving the health and agricultural subsectors and ending the country's isolation. He further highlighted the urgency for institutional, electoral and constitutional reforms in line with what he described as "our new democratic principles that will respond to the realities of our time." The President pointed out to his Cabinet that all these will be addressed alongside with the Civil Service and Security as well as state owned enterprise reforms.

In line with democratic principles, President Barrow advised Cabinet to debate constructively to reach consensus on the common agenda. This, he said, will require collective responsibility to further the national development agenda. He called on the cabinet to work hard and take advantage of the good will of our development partners to achieve the expectations of Gambians.

Also last year, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) orgnaised a three-day retreat for Cabinet on the theme "Collaborative Leadership and Dialogue". Its objectives were to achieve more effective and holistic strategies for inclusive processes that advance governance in the country and identify key priorities of the government and refocus on ways forward.



In October 2017 President Adama Barrow swore in six new Gambian judges to ensure that in future, the entire Gambian judicial system would be efficiently and professionally managed by qualified Gambians.

The judges are expected to uphold virtues of integrity, professional ability, command trust and respect through their conduct. Such virtues would preserve public confidence in the competence and independence of the judicial system. The judges were reminded that citizens rely on the law, and that the oath they took requires that justice be done according to the law, without discrimination.

President Barrow assured the new judges that his administration would continue to create the conducive environment for them to deliver on their mandate without any interference from the Executive branch. He urged them to maintain impartiality and be fearless in the administration of the law.

The appointment of Justice Awa Bah marks the first time that a woman has been appointed as President of the Court of Appeal. Half the number of new judges sworn-in today is women. The appointments reflect President Barrow's commitment to promote gender equality in decision-making positions.













The National Security Council inaugurated

President Adama Barrow in August 2017 launched a seven-member National Security Council (NSC). He urged the Council members to work together and complement their efforts. The President emphasized the unity of purpose amongst the members in serving one government for a strong, safe and secure nation. The Gambian leader said with coordination and corporation, the different units of the armed and security forces could overcome potential from being real threats, nationally and globally to guarantee the security of all Gambians. President Barrow urged the various security units to take up their responsibilities to protect the country.

"Let us through our Gambia Police Force and related services enforce our laws and deter the criminals. Let us through our State Intelligence Service based on informed analysis, provide advice to policy makers to enable them make informed policy options, take decisions and enhance strategic interventions."

The importance of having structures in place to properly advise to make informed decisions on security matters are linked to peace and security to socio-economic development.

The launching of the NSC was followed with the Security Sector Reform Project in September 2017.

President Barrow recalled the situation of the sector when he took over the leadership of the country. "When my administration was sworn in last January, it was clear to us that we were taking over a security sector that had been deeply politicised and not responsive to the needs of our people."



Security Sector Reform Project Launched

The reforms initiated are to ensure an effective and accountable security sector under democratic control with full respect for human rights, the rule of law, and fundamental principles of good governance. The reform is to transform the country's security sector into a functional and effective one that delivers for the good of the Gambian people.

Supported by the United Nations and other partners, the Security Sector Reform project is an initiative by the Barrow administration to transform the country's security sector into institutions that are effective, professional and accountable to the state and the people of The Gambia. It will help the government design and implement an inclusive security reform strategy, which will ensure that the security forces accomplish their constitutional mandate and mission, in line with the rule of law and democratic principles of transparency and accountability.

The government has set up a steering committee to provide guidance and oversight of the reform process. It is made up of representatives from relevant ministries, including Defense, Interior, Foreign Affairs, International Cooperation and Gambians Abroad, Finance, Justice, and key security sector reform partners, notably the United Nations, African Union, the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) and the European Union (EU).



President Launches Security Sector Reform Project

The security sector reform project is an important political process backed by the United Nations Development Project Banjul office and other partners. The UN Secretary-General's Special Representative, Dr. Mohamed Chambas, explained that the security sector reform process ought to be inclusive and participatory, with the aim of making justice and security institutions accessible and responsive to the needs and rights of all Gambians.

ECOWAS Ambassador to The Gambia Vabah Gayflor said ECOWAS was proud of the restoration of democracy in The Gambia. There is optimism for The Gambia to set the pace in the implementation of its security sector reform and to serve as the security sector reform template to follow in Africa.

EU Ambassador Attila Lajos said security sector reform in The Gambia faced deepseated challenges after 22 years of a repressive regime. He added that the country's stability was important, and reforming the security sector was a key priority in stabilizing its democracy and corps and senior officials. making The Gambia a hub for human rights champion.

The fulfillment of the commitment of partners on their promise to The Gambia, coordination and timely sequencing are of paramount importance for the success of the implementation of the reform. The reform process would lead to the emergence of a professional, ethical and competent security sector. This will position the country to confront the security challenges of the 21st century and promote a democratic society. It will also strengthen the environment for economic development. The futuristic reform would balance defense and the needs of the country, while working with various structures of society.

Former Interior Minister Hon. Mai Ahmad Fatty, expressed optimism in the future of national security and the challenges of the 21st century.

The new National Security Adviser, Retired Colonel Momodou Badjie and the Director of Press and Public Relations, OP moderated the launching, and was attended by security chiefs, cabinet ministers, members of the diplomatic

The strong ties are further expressed with the support Nigeria continues to provide to The Gambia, with the active presence of the Nigerian contingent to the ECOWAS Military Mission in The Gambia.

The exchange visit allowed the group to learn from The Gambia how its military uses skills in engineering, construction, and medical outreach to engage and contribute to national development. It was meant to enhance their skills in the development of their career, as fighters and peace makers. The military is one of the security units playing a pivotal role in the ongoing security transformation of The Gambia.

In New York, President Adama Barrow attended the 72nd United Nations General Assembly -UNGA72. There he made his maiden statement at the UNGA72 and the African Union meeting on Global attended the debates.


Apart from his widely acclaimed speech, President Barrow made history by being the first Gambian President to sign five United Nations treaties at once, while General Assembly.

Alongside the Assembly, the President participated in the UN meeting on the Sustainable Development Goals, partnership towards Harnessing the Demographic Dividend in Africa. He also held bilateral meetings with several world leaders, business leaders, individuals and groups. In his last engagement, he attended a town hall meeting with attending the 72nd United Nations hundreds of Gambians and friends of The Gambia.

The Moroccan Minister of Foreign Affairs, Nasser Bourita, an envoy of His Majesty, King Muhammad IV, while attending the United Nations General Assembly in New York made a courtesy call President Adama Barrow to promote African solidarity and to improve relations with The Gambia. Their discussion also emphasized the importance of security in achieving other development goals.

The Gambia has turned a new page in its history to bring in new laws that would promote equality and justice. Morocco is building a new office complex for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in The Gambia, contributing to the infrastructural development of the country.

Foreign Ambassadors present their letters of credence

The new Gambian government continues to build its diplomatic relations globally. Under the year under review, The Gambia strengthened bilateral ties with thirteen countries in Africa, Middle East, Asia, Europe and North America.

President Barrow received envoys from Turkey, United Kingdom, Guinea Bissau, Kuwait. Mauritania, Nigeria, Korea, Switzerland, Namibia, Canada, Netherlands, Austria and Germany. The Ambassadors presented their letters of credence to President Barrow and pledged to cement relations, in various sectors, including education, health, fisheries and mechanised agriculture, while also looking at investment in trade, energy and telecommunication. Technology, access to clean water, Tourism are areas that would be strengthened through diplomatic ties.

President Barrow told the diplomats that his government advocates for peace and democracy, as well as encourages communication and dialogue between countries.

The Gambian leader expects closer cooperation with the wider world to yield support for the country's National Development Plan. He urged the development partners to support the resource mobilisation conference scheduled to take place in early 2018, for the effective implementation of the national agenda for reforms in various sectors including the security, judiciary and civil service. An improved energy sector promotes investment, thus creating jobs, and building confidence of the youth to address the multi thronged dimension of migration with skilled labour force.

The Gambia's membership to the International Criminal Court – ICC, promotes the principles of democracy. Regional cooperation through South-South Cooperation and collaboration at the multilateral level is important in foreign relations.

"Nobody wants to be isolated. We want to be part of all international bodies. This was one man's decision and not something that was put to all Gambians. If it had been a referendum, the decision would never have been taken." Said President Barrow.





The President learnt about the obsolete generators that were purchased. He was informed that NAWEC was working on various projects to boost generation capacity and alleviate the pain being felt by the Gambian public in terms of electricity supply. The President was shown one of several new generators — a 6.5 megawatt capacity generator, which was being installed at the Kotu power plant and a second new generator at Brikama. NAWEC also reported that it was also implementing a new 11 megawatt generation expansion project

at the Kotu Power Station by the end of December. It promised that another new 8.9 megawatt generator will go into operation in February 2018 to significantly overcome the challenges.

"I think my visit was timely. I know that there is a lot of concern out there. People are talking and complaining about electricity. I want them to understand that we are taking this seriously. It is important for us to inform the public about what is being done, and how best we can solve the problem."

Education and Youth Empowerment

Curbing youth migration

The Barrow government has continued to engage its development partners to address youth migration and other development challenges.

A major partner, the European Union, has conducted several missions to The Gambia dialogue with the government on various areas of cooperation including youth migration. In August 2017, the Director

EU latest figures in August 2017, indicate that some 12,000 Gambian migrants arrived in Europe. Gambians were said to be among the highest percentage of youths leaving their home country for Europe. Conversely, some young Gambians are known to have voluntarily returned home from Libya with the hope of resettling back in the Gambia.

General of the European Commission's Directorate for Development Coordination, West and Central Africa, Ms Carla Montesi and team made a courtesy call on President Adama Barrow. During the discussions, European Union pledged significant financial and technical support to The Gambia. 
are coming back to their home and family. Key in this is empowerment, engagement and employment." With renewed commitment and relevant skills, the youth could realise the change and take responsibility.

I allowed the business to dictate what to do and my business grew and I ended having my headquarters. I never gave up on hope, determination and hard work." 

From the last reporting in July to January 2017, 68 News releases were shared from State House, bringing the total number of news releases from February 2017 – December 2017 to a total of 129 disseminated to the public.

Social media also continues to attract people in and around the globe. This has been reflected in the increase in the number of followership of President Barrow's social media handles. There is an increase in the **BarrowPORG** Facebook page followership from 10K followers to 17K, an increase of followership by 70% and from 9943 likes to 16,688, an increase of 68% likes on Facebook. Meanwhile the twitter handle @**BarrowPresident** followers has increased from 1286 to 3356, an increase of 161% in six months.

Thus such interest is a motivation for the team to continue to reach out, as more people are eager to be informed about President Barrow's policy decisions and engagements in support of the Coalition government's development agenda.
